CACREP Outcomes Report

The Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program at Bellevue University is a CACREP (Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Programs) accredited program. This accreditation by CACREP provides recognition that the content and quality of the program has been evaluated and meets standards set by the profession. Our CACREP accredited program has been in place since June of 2016. This past year, 814 individuals applied to the MSCC program and 277 matriculated.

Licensure Exam Pass Rate:

Surveys of graduates over the past academic year indicate a self-report pass rate for national licensure exams of 50 % for those who took the exam (n=10; with a response rate of 16%).

Program Graduates and Completion Rate:

In the 2022-23 academic year, 127 students graduated from the MSCC/MSCMHC program. Our current completion rate is 50.0% within four years of starting the program.

Licensure Rate:

Graduate surveys conducted over the past academic year show a rate of successful licensure (provisional/initial) for those who applied for licensure of 90% (n=10; with a survey response rate of 16%).

Clinical Counseling Job Placement Rate:

Graduate surveys conducted over the past academic year show a job placement rate of 90% (n=10; with a survey response rate of 16%).
