DACA | DREAMER FAFSA Ineligible Scholarships

A big part of the BRUIN Experience is allowing you to focus on your classes without being overwhelmed by the cost of a college education. This starts with our scholarship program. Read through the list below to find potential scholarship opportunities for DACA or undocumented students.

Scholarships are awarded in a wide variety of areas. Be sure to check bellevue.edu/scholarships as well as other outside sources to maximize your scholarship opportunities.

Prerequisites for all (unless otherwise specified):

- Part-time enrollment
- Financial need (Federal Student Aid Estimator)
- Additional requirements for each opportunity
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for undergraduate students or 3.0 for graduate students on a 4.0 scale

Bruin Advantage Scholarship (RENEWABLE)**

- Incoming freshman who have just graduated from a high school within the U.S. or a U.S. owned territory
- See eligibility matrix online for additional criteria
- Financial need not required

Access Opportunity Scholarship

- Have earned a GED certificate with a minimum averaged GED score of 165 or higher

Accounting Faculty Scholarship

- Pursuing an undergraduate accounting degree, MBA with an accounting concentration, or MS Accounting
- Minimum of 12 credit hours earned in residence (6 hours in upper level courses for undergraduate students)
- Accounting GPA of at least 3.0

Athletic Training Scholarship

- Interested in pursuing a career in athletic training
- Financial need not required

Bellevue Community Scholarship

- Graduating high school senior from Bellevue West or Bellevue East High School
- Must be enrolled full-time

Cooper Foundation - Students of Color Scholarship (RENEWABLE)**

- Incoming freshman or transfers at the undergraduate level
- Nebraska residents
- Ethnicity of African-American/Black, Latino/Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, or American Indian/Alaska Native
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher

El Camino Latino Scholarship (RENEWABLE)**

- Latino/Hispanic ethnic origin
- Residents of the State of Nebraska or of Pottawattamie County, Iowa
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 for undergraduate or 3.0 for graduate -or- have earned a GED certificate with a score of 165 or higher
- In pursuit of an undergraduate or graduate degree
- Must be enrolled full-time

Institute for Mexicans Abroad Scholarship

- Nebraska or Iowa residents who are Mexican, Mexican-American, or of Mexican origin

Jerry and Gloria Mosser Endowed Scholarship

- Current Bellevue University student-athletes of any sport
- High School ACT composite score of 18 or higher
- Received academic honors and/or recognition while in high school or at previous college

Kaufmann-Cummings Foundation Scholarship

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Deferred Action students only

Mike and Charlene Fuchs Scholarship

- Residents of Nebraska county of Cass, Dodge, Douglas, Lancaster, Sarpy, Saunders or Washington or Iowa county of Harrison, Mills or Pottawattamie
- Undergraduate students only

Marshall and Mona Faith Endowed Scholarship

- Have a minimum overall GPA of 3.0 or scored a 165 or higher on the GED
- First preference given to first generation students

Mascot Scholarship (RENEWABLE)**

- Restricted to traditional, residential students who are/will reside locally
- Be approximately 5'8"-6' in height
- Be physically able to manage extended periods of time in the mascot suit (standing and actively moving around), and must be outgoing, creative, and excited to promote school spirit
- Candidates cannot be pursuing other collegiate athletics
- Must be enrolled full-time
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Financial Need not required

Milton Mendel and Marsha Kleinberg Endowed Student Support Fund

- Residents of Nebraska or Iowa
- Have a minimum overall GPA of 2.0 or scored a 165 or higher on the GED

Morris Miller Memorial Endowed Scholarship

- Nebraska residents who live in the Greater Omaha Metropolitan Area with a zip code of 68005, 68105, 68106, 68107, 68108, 68113, 68117, 68123, 68127, 68133, 68147 or 68157
- Deferred Action students only
- Undergraduate students only

Nebraska Society of CPAs Scholarship

- Live in the state of Nebraska
- Pursuing a degree related to accounting
- Have completed his/her junior year
- Planning to sit for the CPA exam
- Will be enrolled at least two terms at Bellevue University
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher for undergraduates or 3.0 or higher for graduates

Quivey-Bay State Foundation Scholarship

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Deferred Action students only

TeamMates – DREAM Scholarship (RENEWABLE)**

- Residents of Nebraska or Iowa
- Must be a TeamMates mentee for at least 3 years
- High School graduating seniors
- Must be enrolled full-time
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Deferred Action students only

The DREAM Scholarship (RENEWABLE)**

- Residents of Nebraska or Iowa
- Undergraduate students only
- First preference given to racial/ethnic minorities, first generation students, students with the greatest financial need and transfer students
- Must be enrolled full-time
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Deferred Action students only

United Parcel Service Scholarship

- Must be a first-generation student, low income student, a member of an ethnic minority, or a new American.
- Undergraduate students only
- Must be enrolled full-time

Virgil Eihusen Scholarship

- Nebraska residents
- Pursuing a degree in business and have entrepreneurial qualities

William Randolph Hearst Foundation Endowed Scholarship

- Age 25 or older
- Financial need not required
