## Receive up to **\$4,000** per year in grant funds

Now is the time if you've been wanting to teach! The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education, or TEACH Grant Program, offers up to \$4,000 per academic year to aspiring teachers in high-needs areas like STEM. You may be able to receive a TEACH grant alongside other scholarships or financial aid you qualify for. With the TEACH Grant program, you can unlock Bellevue University's other advantages, including:

- 50-acre campus and a residential campus community that's easy to get to know and navigate
- Some teacher education classes offered in evenings for working students
- Smaller classes, with a 1:14 faculty to student ratio, means you can get to know your professors and your classmates
- \$28 million investment into student life and academic buildings, including a state-of-the-art Athletics Field House
- Caring faculty and staff, including a Student Coach who stays with you as a point of contact from admissions through graduation
- Diverse campus community, with students from every background
- Contemporary student housing and dorms to help you make the most of your college experience

### Who's eligible?

- Bellevue University students enrolled in the Bachelor of Science in Education or Master of Arts in Teaching degree.
- You will earn your first degree or first teaching certificate.
- Your FAFSA is submitted and on file with Bellevue University.
- You must also maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.25\* and meet Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements.

Note: Bellevue University participates in the federal TEACH Grant program which offers up to \$4,000 based on student's enrollment level, less applicable fees, per academic year.  
\*GPA requirements vary based on your student type.
